



Assignment 1: Map of Canada

Dear Zombie Outbreak Response Agent:

Once the zombie apocalypse ends, it will be up to you and your fellow Zombie Outbreak Response Teams across the country to pick up the pieces and help Canada rebuild. For this reason, it is important that you are familiar with the geography not just of your own region, but of the entire country. You will use the blank map in your folder to create a reference map for yourself. You may use the atlases and the textbook to find the information you need to place on the map. Each person on the Response Team must complete a map.

Please label:

- 10 provinces
- 3 territories
- 13 provincial capitals
- Canada's capital city
- Hudson Bay
- James Bay
- St. Lawrence River
- Pacific, Arctic and Atlantic oceans
- The Great Lakes

Your map must also:

- Include a compass
- Include a title
- Be **neatly** coloured with pencil crayon, with bodies of water in blue and different provinces in different colours
- Be stapled to this assignment sheet
